

Results of Tokyo-iCDC Risk Communication Team's Preliminary Survey on Residents' Awareness

Survey Method: Web survey of monitors registered with an online research company

Target Audience: Men and women residing in Tokyo from their 20s to 70s

Goal: 200 responses per age group from 20s to 70s (100 from each gender)
(Aiming for 200 responses combined for those in their 60s and 70s)

Period: October 15 to 17, 2020

Structure:

Q1 Efforts being used to avoid COVID-19

Q2 Awareness of COVID-19

Q3 Familiarity with monitoring analysis

Q4 Desired information for the winter

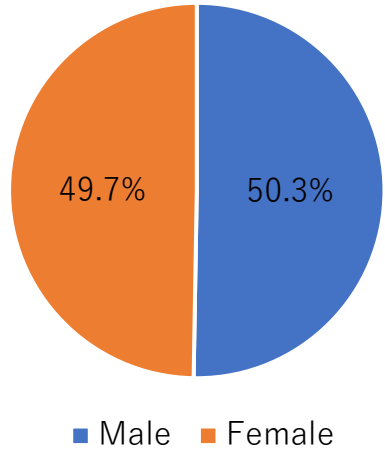
Q5 Issues and concerns faced (open answer)

Note: Since the data does not guarantee representativeness (it doesn't correspond to Tokyo's population composition ratio, and the sample size is small), it was conducted as a preliminary survey

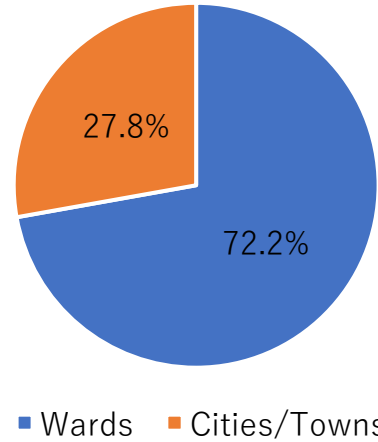

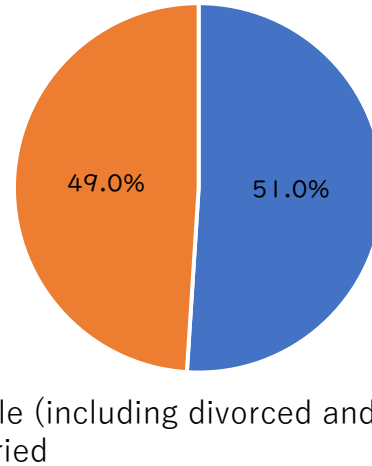
Respondent's Gender



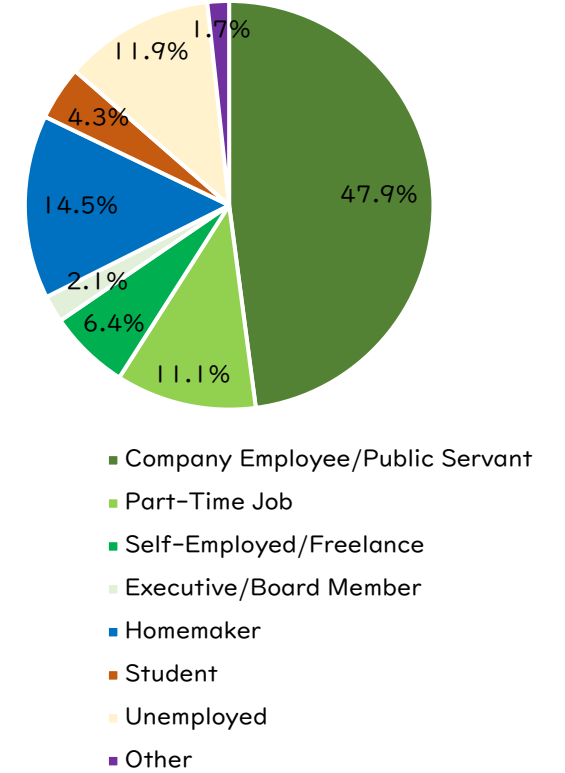
Respondent's Location



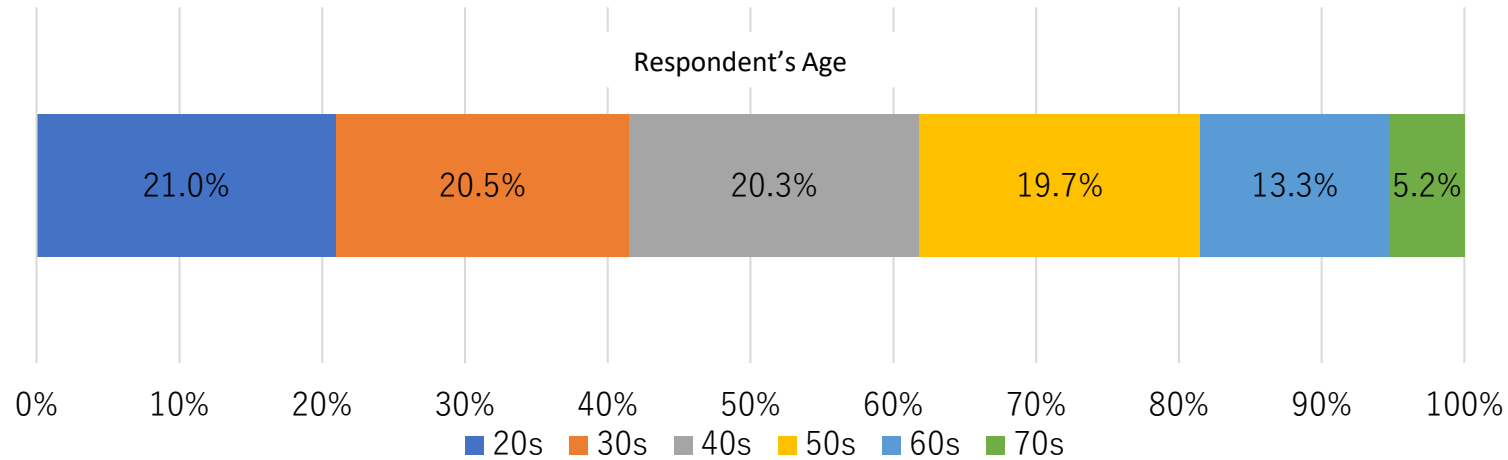
Respondent's Marital Status



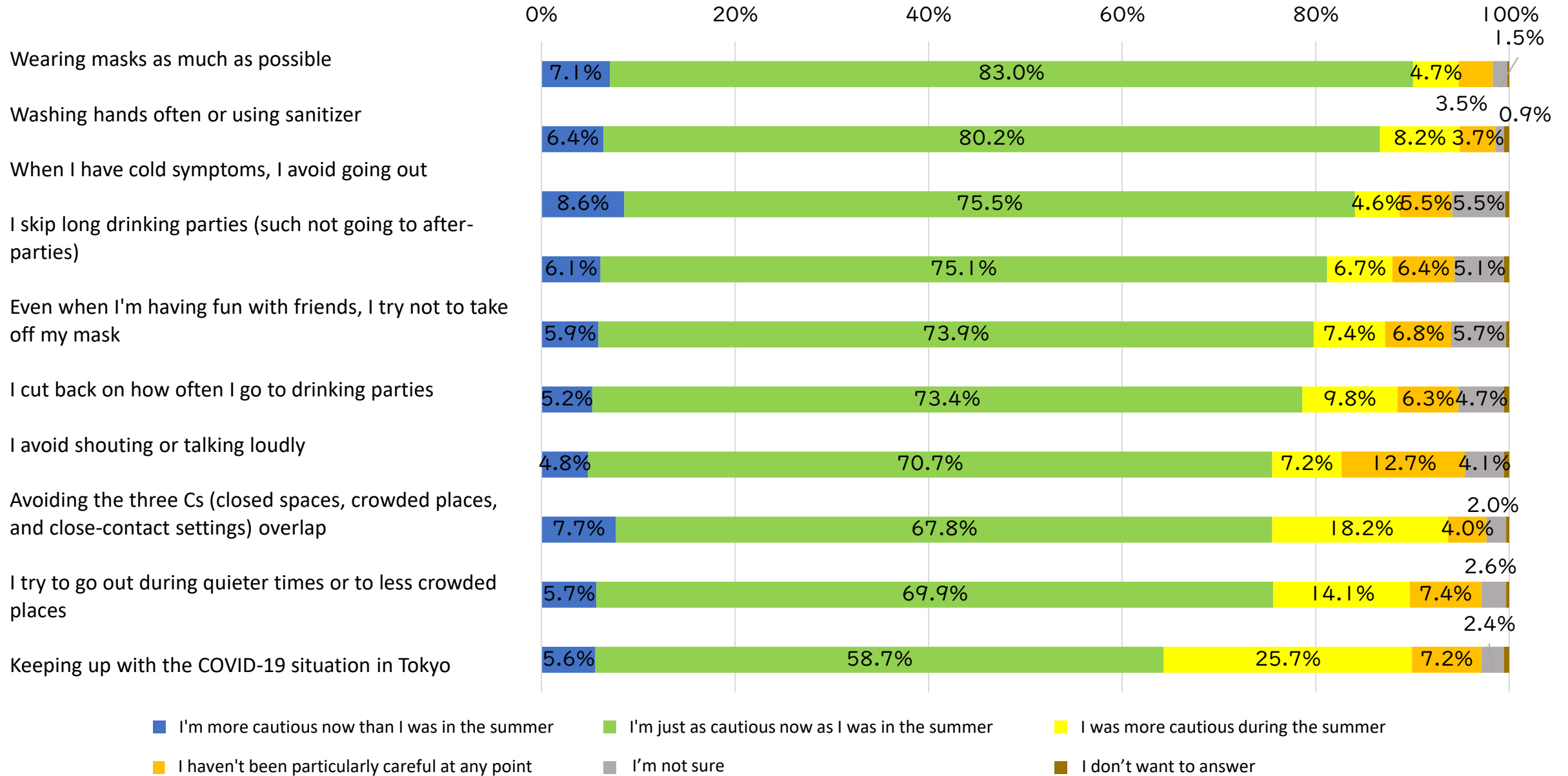
Respondent's Career



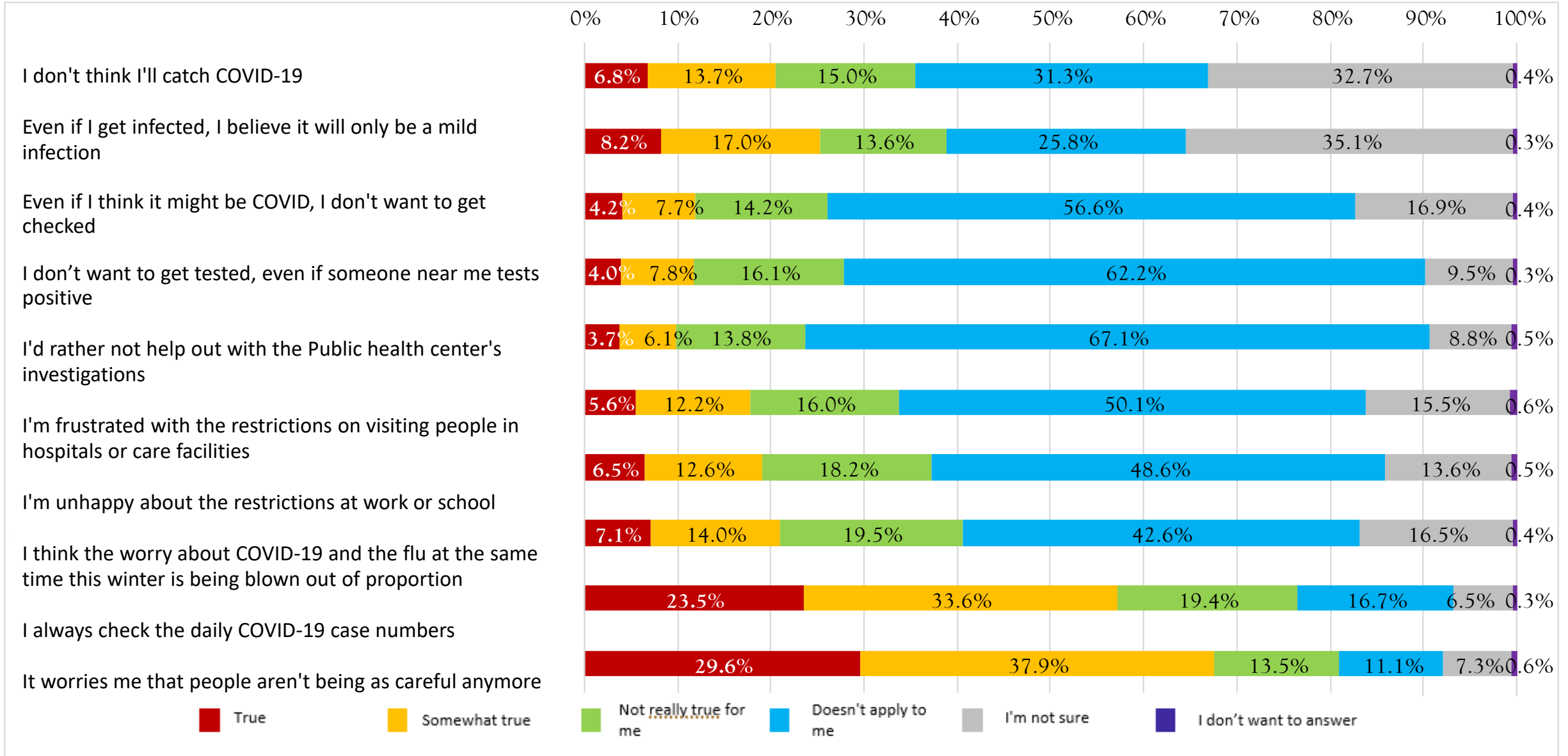
Respondent's Age



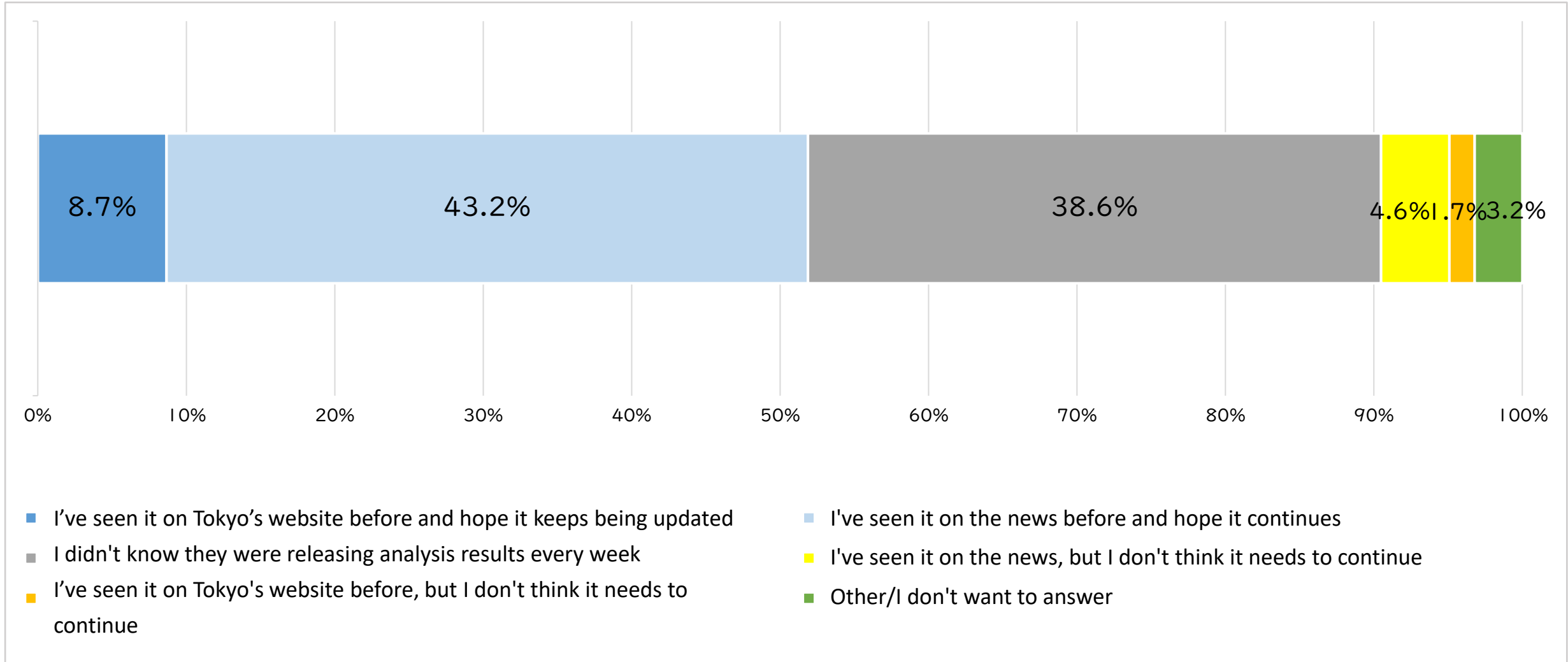
Q1 Compared to this summer (June/July, when the second wave began), which of the following statements best describes your current approach to COVID-19 measures? (Single answer)



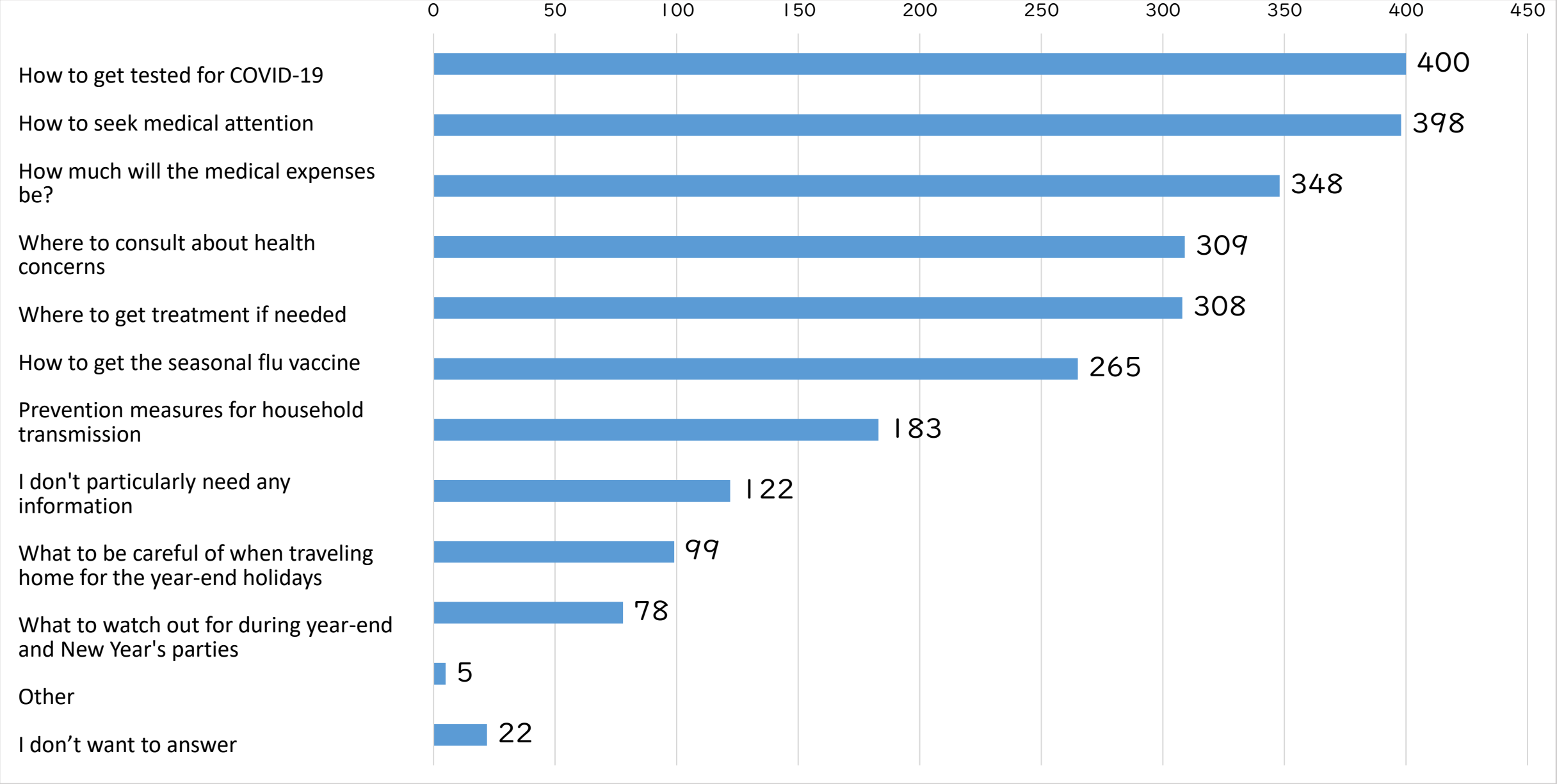
Q2 Please select the option that best matches how you're feeling right now.

[Open Answer]

- About 30% of respondents provided answers.
- The older the age group, the more people tended to respond.
- The problems and concerns of Tokyo residents spanned various categories (provisional classifications):
 - "Fear of COVID-19 and infectious diseases"
 - "Social and psychological stress"
 - "Uncertainty about the future"
 - "Judging others (dissatisfaction with others' behavior)"
 - "Worries about family and acquaintances"
 - "Immediate concerns"
 - "Concerns about living conditions, work, and study"
 - "Anxiety and dissatisfaction about the lack of information" etc.
