

COVID-19 Control in Operation of Athlete's Village (Infection Control)

Body temperature measurement

Body temperature was measured with a non-contact thermometer at entry in Athlete's Village

Prevention of droplet infection

- Frequent ventilation in the facilities of Athlete's Village and placement of acrylic boards in Main Dining Hall and Fitness Gyms
- Ensuring physical distances by indicating foot signs
- Interviews with the players were limited to the Mix Zone set up in the Village Plaza.

Prevention of contact infection

- Placement of hand sanitizers at various places
- Distribution of COVID-19 Control Kit containing alcohol disinfectant etc. to the athletes/officials

Avoidance of congestion

- A signage was set to indicate congestion status of Main Dining Hall etc.

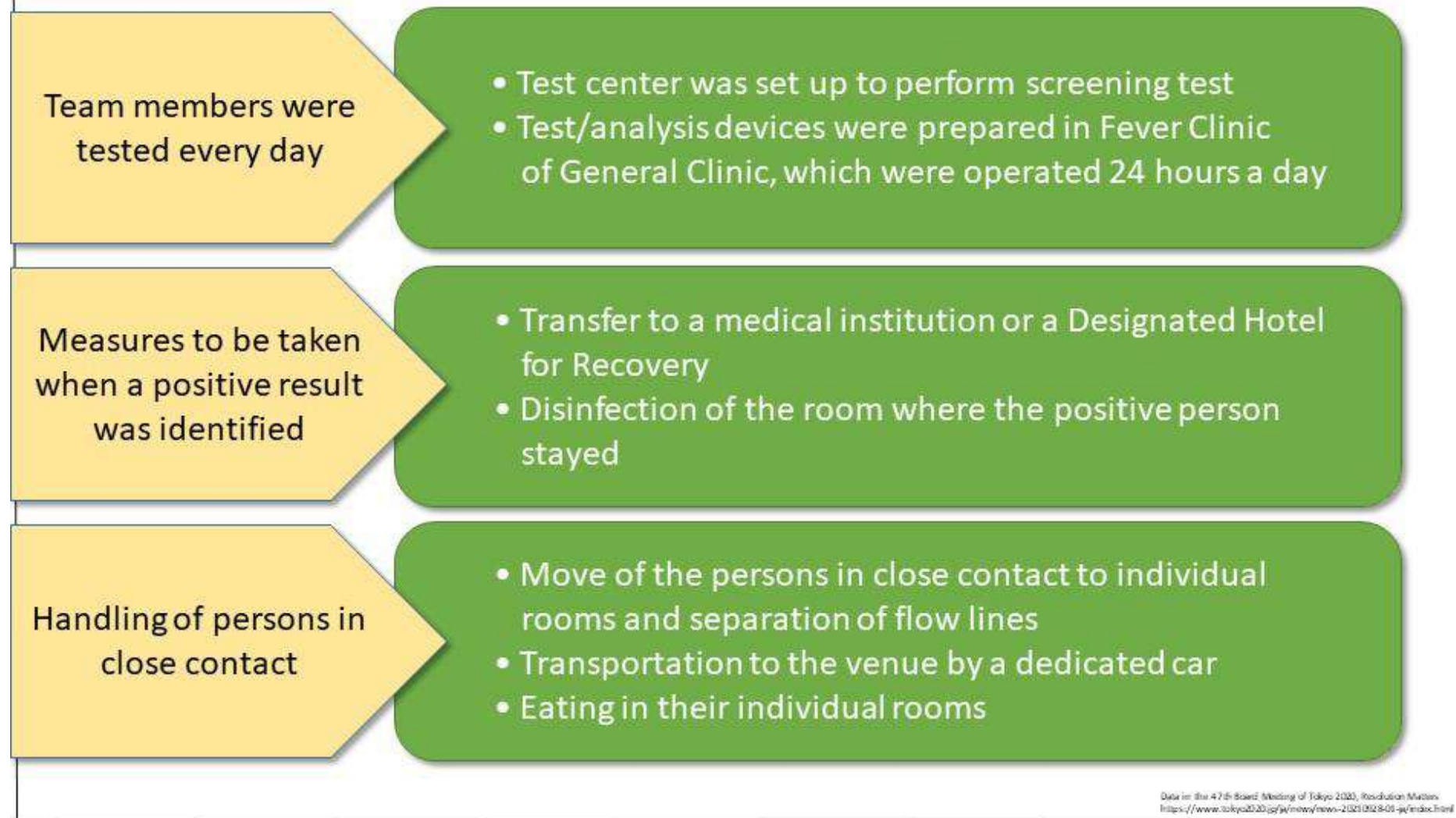

COVID-19 Control in Operation of Athlete's Village (Tests and Handling of Positive Persons)



Cases of Breach of Play Book etc.

Punishments were decided rapidly after discussion with IOC/IPC

	Severe reprimand	Temporary suspension of Accreditation	Deprivation of Accreditation
Olympic	32 persons	9 persons	15 persons
Paralympic	29 persons	1 person	3 persons

- ☑ Severe reprimand
 - Officials Minor breach of isolation within the 14-day isolation period after the entry by going out in this period
 - Officials Eating/drinking in group in hotels
 - Athletes etc. Not using a mask in the spectator's seat. Troubles in Athlete's Village, etc.
- ☑ Temporary suspension of Accreditation
 - Officials Eating/drinking in group in hotels (reprimanded more than once) etc.
- ☑ Deprivation of Accreditation
 - Athletes etc. Breach by going out for sight seeing
 - Officials Entry into FOP without permission
 - Athletes etc. Criminal cases such as violence and marijuana possession

Entry and Departure

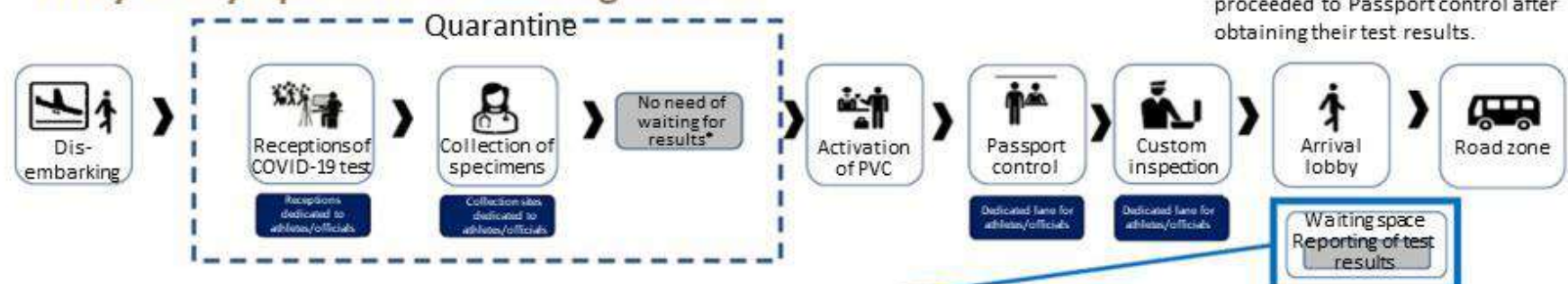
- Under border control for COVID-19 in Japan, entry was specially permitted only if “Action Plan in Japan” that described the hotel and destinations within 14 days after the entry was submitted to and approved by the Government, after a certain isolation period (waiting period for 14 days, 3 days and 0 days).
- In particular, the Covid Liaison Officer (CLO) of each Stakeholder (SH) submitted the Action Plan in Japan for each of entering persons to be handled to FA in charge of the Organising Committee. The Organising Committee and the Government reviewed them and those whose entry were considered necessary were accepted as athletes/officials.
- There was some confusion in the aspects of announcement of the entry system and use of the system (ICON/OCHA), and entries were permitted only after being supported by the Organising Committee in some cases. However, about 14,000 Action Plans in Japan were approved during the Games and all SH truly required for the Games successfully entered.

Outline of Handlings in the Airports

- For entry, athletes/officials were tested for COVID-19 before passport control and custom inspection
- Before the test, Government’s approval of Action Plan in Japan and COVID Certificate before the departure were confirmed
- Separation of flow lines and liaison guidance were introduced for so-called Bubble Formation to prevent contact between athletes/officials of the Olympic/Paralympic Games and other entrants

Issues and Handlings (Retention/Congestion in Entry for the Olympic Games)

- When Olympic SH entered, retention and congestion occurred in the airport for various reasons.
- To smoothen the entry procedure, continuous efforts were made to establish more appropriate operation in cooperation and coordination with the Government and Airport Companies

Establishment of the operation for rapid entry of the teams

→ A separate dedicated waiting place was set for the teams (after leaving the arrival area)

Long time waiting at first reception of quarantine

(Multiple flights arrived in the same time zone and entries of SHs were concentrated)
→ Strengthened quarantine capacity (opening a new quarantine area)
→ Additional receipt desks

Low percentage of entry with OCHA

(Not preparing OCHA in advance or unable to use OCHA, etc.)
→ Stakeholder Owner FA announced need of previous preparation
→ Entry procedure with documents was permitted to avoid long-term retention

Lack of manpower associated with complicated entry operation

→ Additional airport liaison officers
→ Support by officers from Cabinet Secretariat, Ministry of Land, Infrastructure and Transport, and Tokyo Metropolitan Government

Testing before Departure/Issue of COVID Certificate

[Background]

- Departure of officials/athletes required COVID Certificate based on the test before Departure
(Required test method and submission mode (data or voucher) differ by country)
→ Problems of constructing the test systems and scheme to issue COVID Certificate

Provision of COVID Certificate as data for ICON users based on their latest result of screening

Setting of the test facility in Athlete's Village to provide COVID Certificate as data

Obtainment of COVID Certificate using a test recommended by a civil test organization under individual responsibility

Testing before Departure/Issue of COVID Certificate

Operation system

- Announcement of the test procedure, the procedure to issue COVID Certificate, and Users Guide to each SHs.
- Setting up a specialist team (MOC-NRC team) in MOC
 - [Members] ICON support staff in MOC + support personnel from the bureaus
 - [Operations] Handling of inquiries about issue of COVID Certificate
Proxy application for COVID Certificate etc.

- Issue by user: 7/24 to 8/11 for the Olympic Games and 8/12 to 9/13 for the Paralympic Games
- Support by the special team: 7/26 to 8/11 for the Olympic Games and 8/12 to 9/12 for the Paralympic Games

The number of positive results include some multiple positive results for the same person.

*Such as second tests following positive tests before departure and urgent tests following suspected positive results on the way from host towns in Japan

[Summary]

- An average of about 14,000 screening tests were performed per day on athletes/officials (36,225/day maximum)
- As most positive cases were asymptomatic carriers who were put into immediate isolation, tests of symptomatic persons were fewer than expected. Positive cases may have been detected before actual disease onset.

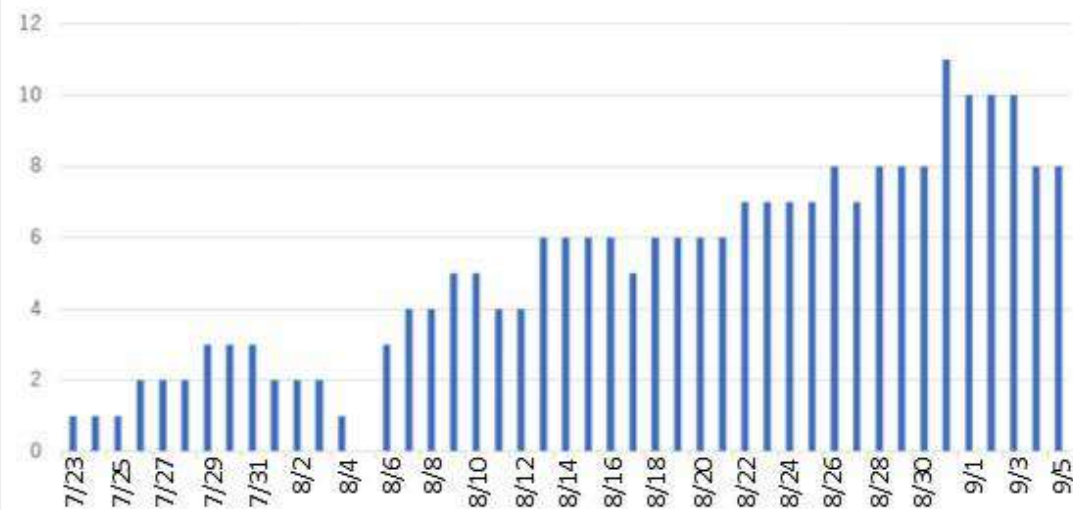
Number of hospitalizations

○Plan

- Athletes/officials positive for COVID-19 and requiring hospitalization were referred to appropriate medical institutions after coordination with Designated Hospitals for the Olympic/Paralympic Games and medical institutions designated by the health care divisions.
- Recovery facilities cooperated to minimize effect on local communities

○Results (quick estimation)

Number of hospitalizations per day (all stakeholders)



○Summary

- Only a few Games participants were hospitalized, while the number of hospitalized Japanese staff increased during the latter half of the Games.

Handling of Positive Athletes/Officials (operation of Designated Hotels for Recovery)

○Plan

■ Subjects

Athletes, etc. with mild or asymptomatic infection

■ Operation period

July 13 to September 17

■ Operation

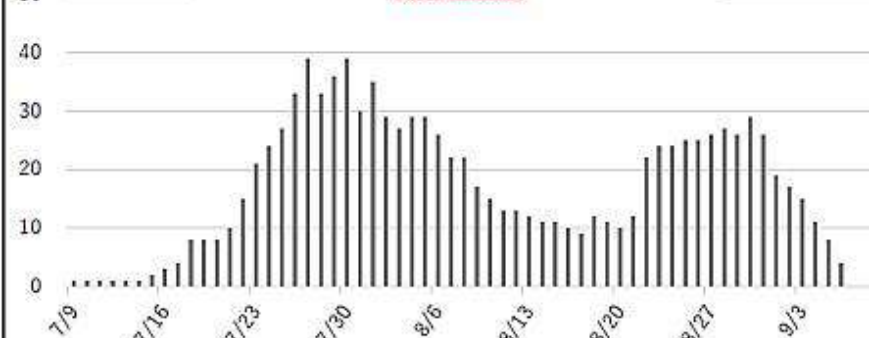
In accordance with the operation criteria for Recovery Facilities in Tokyo

- Strict differentiation of entry areas by zoning
- The recovery stay was basically 10 days
- Confirmation of health status by HCP
- Nurses and clerical staff were on duty 24 hours a day

○Results (quick estimation)

Number of athletes, etc. admitted to Designated Hotels for Recovery

* Not the number of new admissions per day, but number of users per day (cumulative)



- Actually operated from July 9 to September 8
- 142 persons were admitted (89 during the Olympic Games and 53 during the Paralympic Games)
- Only one person was hospitalized during the recovery period.

○Summary

- Support by medical staff from IOC/IPC: 20 members from IOC and 8 members from IPC (including overlapping members)
- Although admission of positive athletes/officials began ahead of schedule, they were admitted in an orderly fashion through quick preparations of meals, bedding and so on.
- During the Paralympic period, a positive case requiring assistance needed urgent admittance, posing problems of lack of manpower and facility/equipment. This case, however, was also handled appropriately (details to follow).
